Sekhon Group Involved in Politics

Narinder Singh Sekhon Conservative Parliamentary candidate for Bradford South attended the Hindu Mandir on Leeds Road Bradford yesterday and received a warm reception from the congregation including president Mukesh Chawla and Dr Dayal Sharma Mbe

During his address, he commented on

“Let’s get Brexit done”

the introduction of £33.9 billion into the NHS

the pledge from the party to introduce 20,000 new police officers to reduce crime on the streets of the United Kingdom.

Parliamentary candidate stated that it was his function if elected as member of Parliament to ensure that his party delivered the pledges in a timely fashion.

Secondly that it was his function to ensure that the £33 .9 billion towards the national health service was directed towards hospitals and clinical services in Yorkshire but in particular for his constituents in Bradford South.

He continued to address the interested congregation and pledged that if elected, he would ensure that the 20,000 officers were not simply monitoring the streets of Southern Cities but were directed towards Bradford where crime is on the rise.

Members of the congregation spoke and said that they would pledge to vote the Conservative party candidate as a consequence of all the negative comments that the Labour Party had made about issues concerning India and Kashmir.

The Parliamentary candidate responded by stating that he was born and raised in Bradford and wanted to direct his attention towards the matters that directly affect the constituents of Bradford South in which he is standing and that his concern was British politics and not politics in other countries as this was beyond his remit at this stage in his political career.

Furthermore, he stated that British politicians should be concerned with matters in Britain and how it affects British people as this is the land in which we live, play and pay our taxes and issues which concern India and Pakistan must be resolved by Politicians who live work and play in India and Pakistan.

He preferred not to comment on these issues save us to say that any atrocity against any human rights and any inhumane treatment against any person was not something which he could personally support irrespective of government, religion, colour or creed.

He wished the best for the situation abroad and said that the ministers and the respective heads of state, Mr Narendra Modhi and honourable Mr Imran Khan were suitably positioned and qualified to resolve these issues in a diplomatic and honourable manner.

The evening ended well in high spirits for both the political candidate and the congregation.
